

Packing list for pheasant hunting:

A blaze orange vest or jacket

Orange hat

Safety glasses

A game carrier

Steel shot shells - bring at least one box of 2 or 3 shot

Lead shot shells - I suggest at least one box for each day you are hunting. We recommend 4 shot with about a 3 3/4 dram equivalent or 1 1/4 oz of powder (most of our hunting is done where we use lead shot).

If you want to shoot clay pigeons bring some shells for that also.

An insulated cooler for transporting your birds back home

Gun - we recommend a gun that holds 4 or more shells, because pheasants often get up in groups.

Hiking boots with good ankle support (that are broken in)

Socks (wool is great)

Towels

Bedding or sleeping bag - we can provide bedding and towels for your stay for \$12.00

Pajamas

Bible, notebook

Flashlight

Warm hat - orange

Camera - If you bring a disposable camera make sure you put your name on it.

Extra pair of shoes to wear around camp

Shampoo

Toothbrush and toothpaste

Check or cash to pay for your hunting. We do not accept credit cards.

Hunting license (this can be purchased upon arrival in SD) we do not have licenses at the camp

Hunter safety certificate

A calling card if you want to call long distance.

Long pants – hunting pants with nylon in the front are nice

Warm layers of clothing (t-shirt, long sleeve shirt, sweat shirt, jacket)

Rain jacket

Tylenol and other personal medication

Gloves with a trigger finger
